



SHSAA Reaches \$10 Million Scholarship Milestone

Since 1908, more than \$10 million in scholarships has been awarded to 2,730 Salem students to help them pursue their career aspirations, thanks to the generosity of alumni and friends. The Salem High School Alumni Association (SHSAA) proudly celebrated this remarkable milestone during its Scholarship Award Ceremony and 144th Annual Meeting on April 26, 2025.

This achievement represents more than a number - it is a testament to over a century of collective commitment to educational opportunity and Quaker community pride. Salem alumni and friends made this possible through their unwavering generosity and dedication to the association's mission and values. Each contribution, large or small, has helped transform lives, reflecting the deep trust placed in SHSAA. The \$10 million milestone is both a celebration of the past and a source of inspiration for building an even brighter future.

The celebration was met with a very special guest at the close of the ceremony. Quaker Sam made a surprise appearance, dancing to Kool and the Gang's "Celebration" as colorful confetti shot out of cannons at the stage area of the auditorium. The excited audience cheered and applauded in recognition of this historic achievement.

Scholarship and Grant Committee Chairman and First Vice President Dr. Peter Apicella '82 remarked, "SHSAA is so proud of the alumni and friends who have provided more than \$10 million in scholarship awards for our students since the incorporation of our fund in 1903 - the first in Ohio. We say thank you to our alumni and friends for their generosity that has touched so many lives."

2025 Scholarship Awards

The highlight of the evening was the presentation of 116 scholarships totaling \$405,500. Forty-nine graduating seniors from the Class of 2025 were honored on stage, while 52 alumni pursuing postsecondary education were recognized in the program and acknowledged during the event.

Four new scholarships debuted this year:

Treasurer's Report and Financial Highlights

Treasurer Wendy Storey Saltsman '77 reported that the association's cash and investment portfolio stood at \$13,476,826 as of December 31, 2024 - an increase of \$1.3 million from the previous year. Of that total, \$3.5 million represents Named Scholarships funded by donors contributing at least \$100,000. In 2024, SHSAA received \$570,804 in contributions and earned \$335,451 in investment income, resulting in net income before depreciation of \$296,631.

Historically, more than 90% of the association's spending has gone directly toward its mission.

New Grants Program

President Harrington highlighted the association's 2023

mission update, which led to the creation of last year's SHSAA Grants Program. These grants, ranging from \$100 to \$500, are available to Salem City School District K–12 teachers to enhance classroom experiences. In 2024, SHSAA awarded \$11,538.79 to 28 classrooms, supporting innovative projects that enriched the educational environment and student growth.

Farewells and Appreciation

Outgoing board members recognized for their service included:

It was announced that a special June meeting was planned by the SHSAA Board of Trustees to formally thank them for their contributions.

Office Manager Denise Chasar was also recognized for her exceptional work, as were Dr. Peter Apicella '82 and Jean Kiliman Esposito '71 for leading and assisting the Scholarship and Grant Committee. All members of the Scholarship and Grant Committee were then thanked for their volunteer service and for a job well done. SHSAA board members were also acknowledged.

Closing Celebration

The evening concluded with an invitation from Executive Director Audrey Cleveland Null '76 to attend a catered SHSAA Open House in the SHS cafeteria. Scholarship recipients, parents, family, alumni, and friends enjoyed fellowship, refreshments, and photo opportunities with Quaker Sam - ending the night on a high note of Salem Quaker pride and celebration.

Quaker Queries Frequently Asked Questions About SHSAA Scholarships

How many SHSAA Named Scholarships are there?

As of fall 2025, there are 32 Named Scholarships. Two additional Named Scholarships are in the process of being approved and will be available to students during the 2026 scholarship application process. Both of these new scholarships will be announced with feature articles in the 2026 Winter/Spring edition of the SHSAA newsletter.

What's the difference between a scholarship granted by SHSAA and an award ?

There are four awards that are given each year to high school and postsecondary applicants. They are the Doris Tetlow Award, the Florence C. Schafer Award, the Leon H. Colley Award, and the Memorial Society Award. These are available to outstanding students who apply for but are not awarded an SHSAA Named Scholarship. Based on merit, need, and availability of funds, the awards do not have a separate application. The Scholarship and Grant Committee, comprised of SHSAA board members, selects these high school and postsecondary awardees.

What qualifies a high school student to receive an Academic Merit Scholarship?

Students who apply and have earned a 3.75 GPA or above on a 4.0 scale qualify for an SHSAA Academic Merit Scholarship.

2025 Honored Alumnus Frank A. Zamarelli, Jr. '82

Prominent Salem businessman and community advocate Frank A. Zamarelli, Jr., was recognized as the 2025 Salem High School Alumni Association Honored Alumnus during its 144th Annual Meeting and Scholarship Award Ceremony on Saturday, April 26, 2025, in the SHS auditorium.

Zamarelli is well known in the Salem community for his computer business and extensive volunteer service. A 1982 graduate of Salem Senior High School, he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from Youngstown State University in 1986. He majored in management with minors in accounting, marketing, and computer technology. In 1987 he established the Salem Computer Center, a full-service computer sales and service business. He recently sold the company to his son-in-law, senior employee Anthony Cappa, and his daughter, Taylor Zamarelli Cappa '13.

Raised in a family deeply involved in the community, Zamarelli became active in church, school, and local events at an early age. As an adult, he has used his skills and expertise to support numerous organizations, offering leadership in board governance, management, marketing, and technology.

Organizations that have benefited from Zamarelli's contributions include the Rotary Club of Salem, the Salem Rotary Foundation, the Salem Area Chamber of Commerce, the Salem Area Chamber of Commerce Foundation, the Hope Cemetery Association, the Grandview Cemetery Association, the First Presbyterian Church Pre-School, A.I.D., Salem Community Theater, Salem Renaissance, Salem Community Center, the Salem Italian American Club Education Fund, St. Paul Home and School Association, St. Paul School Foundation, Salem High School Alumni Association, SHS Choir Boosters, and the Kent State - Salem Business Advisory Board.

Zamarelli also works with Salem City Schools as the SHS Auditorium Manager and serves as a sports announcer and scorekeeper for Quaker football, girls and boys basketball, wrestling, and volleyball. As president of the SHS Alumni Association, he was instrumental in bringing back a live Quaker Sam mascot to Salem High School sporting events. Zamarelli also volunteers weekly at St. Paul Church as a member of the video streaming team.

Since 1992, he has been married to his wife, Glory. They have two daughters, Taylor Zamarelli Cappa, SHS Class of 2013, and Brittany Zamarelli Maniscalco, SHS Class of 2016, who is married to Tony Maniscalco, SHS Class of 2016. Zamarelli enjoys spending time with his family and proudly brags about the two newest members of his clan, his granddaughters Francesca "Frankie" Maniscalco and Lucia Marie Maniscalco.

In his remarks at the 144th Annual Meeting, Zamarelli again demonstrated his love for the school system and its students as he shared his life lessons with the graduating seniors:

It is an absolute privilege to stand before you tonight as the 2025 Honored Alumnus of the Year of Salem High School. This place, these halls, this community—it's where I first learned the values that would shape my journey beyond these doors. And now, today, you stand at the threshold of your own next great chapter.

Graduation is an incredible milestone. It's the culmination of years of late-night studying, early-morning classes, friendships forged in the cafeteria, concerts and productions performed on the auditorium stage, sporting events at Sebo Stadium or the Cabas Gymnasium, and lessons learned both in and outside the classroom. You've faced challenges—some small, some monumental—but through perseverance and resilience, you've made it here. And for that, I congratulate each and every one of you.

I want to share with you a lesson I learned after I left Salem High in 1982. It's simple, yet powerful: Success isn't measured by titles, wealth, or prestige — it's measured by growth, by impact, and by the way you lift others along your way. When I walked out of the doors of Salem High School as a graduate, I believed success meant following a straight path. I thought I knew exactly where I was headed. But life, as I quickly learned, doesn't move in straight lines. It twists, turns, throws challenges in your path, and sometimes, takes you in a direction you never imagined. But through those unexpected turns, I discovered my passions, built resilience, and learned the value of persistence.

So, as you step into the world, remember this: It's okay not to have everything figured out. It's okay to try, to fail, to change your mind, and to redefine your dreams along the way. The most successful people are those who embrace change, keep learning, and never let fear dictate their decisions. You are leaving Salem High School with more than just a diploma. You're leaving with values that matter—determination, kindness, integrity. Take those with you wherever you go. Use them to lead, to innovate, to inspire. Your journey from here may take you across the country or keep you close to home, but no matter where life leads you, remember that this Salem community, this school, and Quaker pride, will always be a part of you. So go forward with confidence, with courage, with enthusiasm. Build a life you're proud of. Be a force for good. Keep growing, keep learning, and always remember that success isn't just about what you achieve—it's about how you impact the world around you.

In conclusion, I will leave you with the words of Pope Francis: "Rivers do not drink their own water; trees do not eat their own fruit; the sun does not shine on itself, and flowers do not spread their own fragrance for themselves. Living for others is a rule of nature. We are all born to help each other. No matter how difficult it is. Life is good when you are happy, but better when others are happy because of you." Congratulations, SHS Class of 2025. The future is yours. Make it extraordinary. And always remember..... GO QUAKERS!

ing, Aging in Place Safely, and Future Home Trends for the 50+.

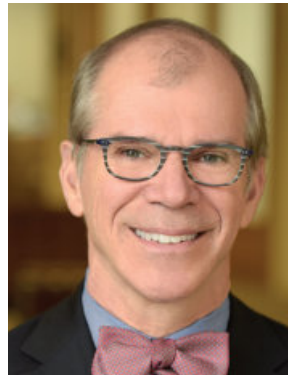
